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Message from Mayor Rachel King

This year's changing of the seasons will be a time of extra transitions here in Amity. At last month's Council meeting our City Administrator, Mike Thomas, gave notice of resignation and will be leaving his position before the second week of this month. Mike will be greatly missed by the Council, staff, and by members of the community. Over the past three years he has accomplished innumerable 'behind the scenes' victories for our city. He has been a friendly and familiar face around town, has worked hard to carry out Council goals, and has improved information and communications to citizen and our business community alike. The City Council has begun the recruitment process to fill the City Administrator position. Given multiple factors, including the importance of finding a good fit to the unique needs of our community, the timeline for hiring is unknown currently.

They have met Amity's sewer and water needs and requirements, overseen our multiple infrastructure projects, attended to maintenance, upkeep, everyday tasks, and emergency situations... all as a crew of two! Their hard work is always appreciated but going above and beyond, as they have, deserves recognition.
